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
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Background

Objectives

Is Audit and Feedback effective to change practice in obstetrics?

- To analyze the effectiveness of audit and feedback regarding each target outcome compared with no audit and feedback or another strategy of implementation.
- To identify the barriers faced during the implementation of audit and feedback for each target outcome.

Selection Criteria

Types of Studies

Cluster, randomized and quasi-randomized controlled trials

Controlled before and after studies and interrupter time series studies

Participants

Facilities where "audit and feedback" has been performed as a strategy to implement practice in obstetrics

Interventions

Audit and feedback X other strategy or none

Selection Criteria

Outcomes

- Effectiveness on behavior change for each target outcome:
 - Prevention actions
 - Management of labour and obstetric complications
 - Procedures
 - Reduction on neonatal complications
- Barriers faced during the implementation



- The Cochrane Handbook for Systematic Review of Intervention
- Meta-analysis of these results for deriving common estimates will be performed if heterogeneity among studies is not significant
