Priorities identified for different populations

- Access to basic health services for women - free services and village medical centre in remote areas

- RH informations - all populations - contraception - STIs
- Age of marriage and first pregnancy
- Full participation of men in RH
- Sensitize adolescent boys on RH

Actions taken since 2005

Family Planning - MCH and nutrition - Preventing unsafe abortion - RTI and STI, HIV - Adolescent sexual and reproductive health - Cervical and breast cancer and other RH morbidities - Infertility - Demand generation for SRH and reproductive rights.

HIV/STI COUNSELING AND INFORMATION CENTRE PROJECT (2013-2015)

In Lao PDR, the social economy is developing and lifestyle changes. A new survey revealed that 65% of young Lao experimented seasonally work in Thailand and other neighboring countries. Based on data from the Counseling Unit of the National Mother and Child Hospital, the MCHH delivers care and checks more than 300 samples from repatriated groups of migrants and some dozens cases of sex abused, physical abused in Vientiane migrant group.

CHALLENGE:

- Vientiane today has no health information centre providing the information to migrant and returnee and help for reintegration process
- Vientiane today has no specific shelter to use for temporary accomodation for migrant with critical health situation.
- Vientiane today has no specific shelter where could coordinate with other institutions for vocational train for migrants.

OBJECTIVES OF THE PROJECT:

To provide information and education related to migrant workers who are returnees and migrant working in Vientiane. To provide temporary accomodation for who has specific indeep issues in life care before reintegration in their own community.

SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES:

- To setup a Counseling and Information Centre.
- To setup a temporary shelter where particular migrant and returnee could spend some time for medical reasons.
- To provide some basic health care and prepare the social welfare steps returnee migrant while they back to family or community.
- To build capacity for the staff in social welfare and community development field.

The 3 years budget is 150'000 US \$ with 20% Lao Government contribution - MCHH New building at Mitthaphab Hospital (Location, hospital facilities, capacity building, vehicle, etc.).

MEDICAL DIAGNOSTIC AND TRAINING CENTRE PROJECT

National Mother and Child Hospital collaboration with NTC Hanoi, Vietnam

The laying of the foundation stone for the new building, in front of the MCH Hospital, Sakarine Road, Vientiane Capital. This centre will serve all patients who need access to the services for diagnostic and treatments on sonography, radiology, hemodialysis and laboratory.

This centre will be also a training center to upgrade skill and knowledge for medical and paramedical personal.

Cooperation - joint business:

The Lao PDR part is 20%:

- Land, facilities (Electricity, water, etc...), part of staff

NTC Hanoi part is 80%:

- Building construction and equipments, management staff, trainers and technical transfers.

Benefit and incomes of the services: 20% MCH Hospital - 80% NTC Hanoi. Duration: 25 years.
