Eligibility:

Applicants should have a recent Ph.D. in economics (or expect to receive a Ph.D. by September 2007), and have a strong background in a relevant field (e.g. macroeconomics, economic growth, labor economics, public economics, health economics or development economics) together with expertise in applied econometrics. Fellows will be selected on the basis of their academic achievement and promise, regardless of nationality. Qualified women and minority candidates are particularly encouraged to apply.

Amount:

Minimum \$45,000. In addition to the annual salary, Fellows will have access to a full range of university resources including benefits.

Interested applicants should submit complete applications:

- a curriculum vita
- graduate and undergraduate transcripts (course work grades)
- a sample of published or unpublished work (journal length article)
- the names of three referees as well as their contact phone numbers and email addresses
