- Supported by the City of Geneva and other Swiss and international institutions

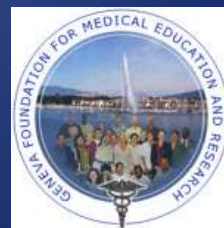
Objective:

- Establish partnerships with relevant agencies and individuals working in the sector



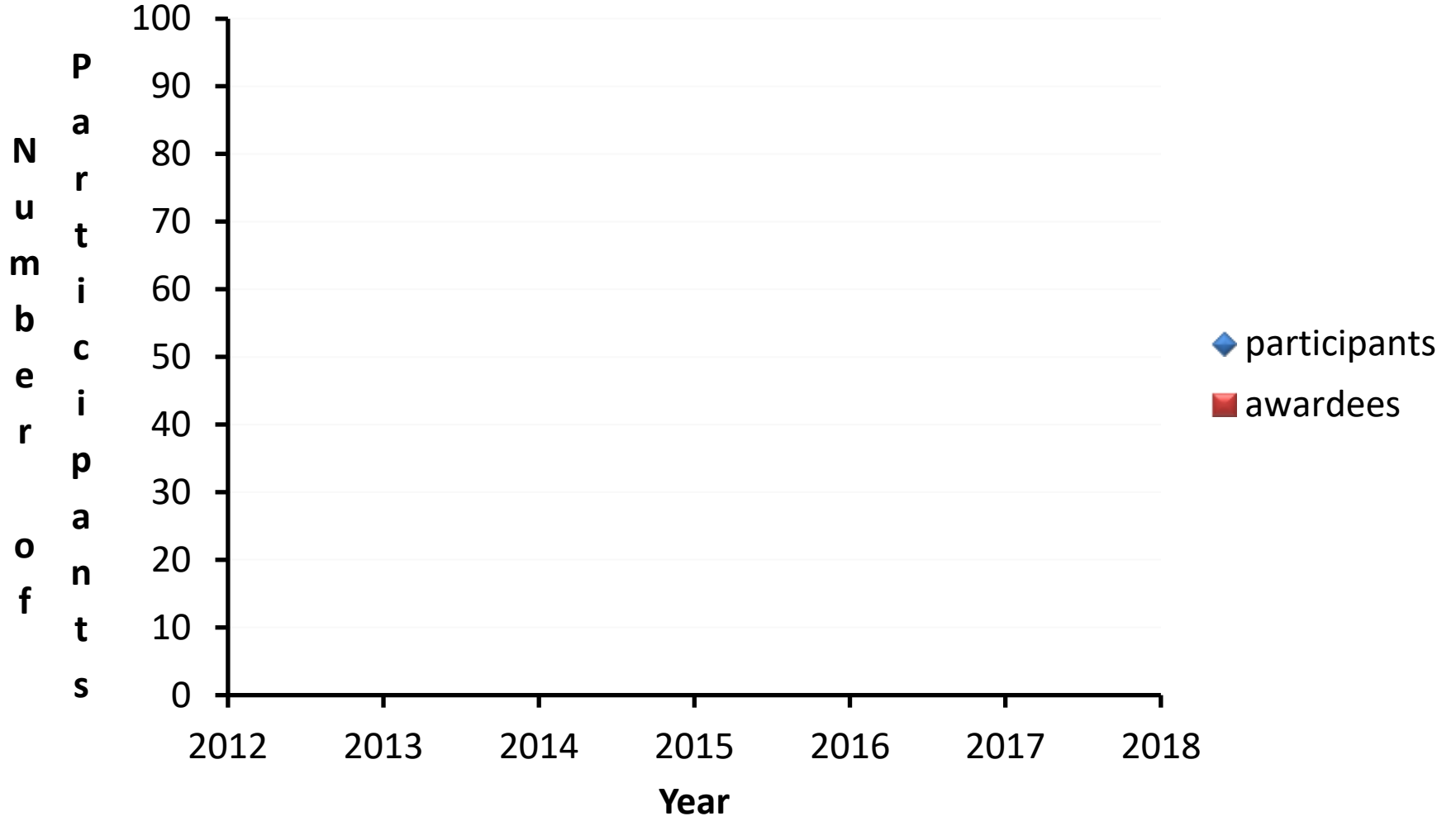

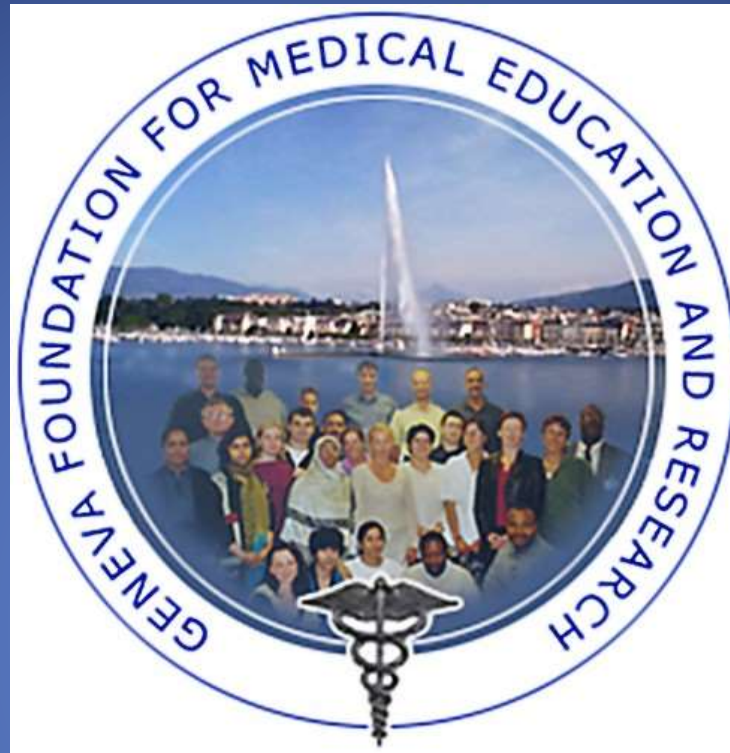
